Examine the status of Gothan and Godhan Nyay Yojna in Chhattisgarh

Abstract

The study aims to impact of gouthan and godhan nyay yojna Godhan Nyay Yojana in Chhattisgarh India. This scheme aims at boosting the rural economy by procuring cow dung at Rs 2 per kilogram from farmers and cattle rearers initially in the rural area later in the urban area too. The procuring of cow dung would be done at the Gouthan, the cowshed built at village panchayat level. After procuring the cow dung, the government would get the procured cow dung turned into vermicompost by Women Self-Help Group (WSHG) and later the organic manure would be sold to the farmer at ₹ 10 per kilogram, encouraging organic fertilizer and discouraging chemical one. The result of the study shows that out of total approved Gothans about 94.27 per cent Gothans were fully constructed and In Bilaspur Division there were maximum numbers (2231 Gothans) of Gothans. Maximum quantity (3003071 quintal) of cow dung were purchased under Durg Division and Maximum numbers of SHGs were in Mahasamund District; 1060 SHGs. In Khairagarh-Chhuhikhadan-Gandai District, there were highest 91.71 percent of sales of vermicompost.

Introduction

Godhan Nyay Yojana' is the scheme launched on 21st July 2020, on the occasion of Hareli, the first festival of the state, by the Chhattisgarh government led by Bhupesh Baghel. the state government would procure cow dung at ₹ 2 per k.g. from the farmers and cattle rearers of the state which will lead to income as well as employment generation initially in the rural pocket later across the state. The procuring of cow dung would be done at the Gouthan, the cowshed built at village panchayat level (Readers' Blog by The Times of India, 2020) [11]. One may notice that our traditional farming systems were characterized by small and marginal farmers producing food and basic animal products for their families by using eco-friendly farming inputs farming was highly sustainable and the practices were fully organic and natural inputs (Bhattacharya and Chakrobarty, G. 2005) [4].

Methodology

The primary goal of this study is to critically assess the Gothan and Godhan Nyay Scheme in light of the current situation. The study's foundation is secondary data that was gathered from numerous sources, and it is descriptive in nature. It makes use of previously published works of literature, research papers, news pieces, magazine articles, blogs, reference websites, and reports. The Objectives and importance of the Gothan and Godhan Nyay plan are covered in the first section. The number of Gothan constructed in the state, the number of SHGs work under the program, and the quantity of vermicompost purchased by various agencies are all covered in the second section. The

status of the Gothan and Godhan Nyay scheme is shown using descriptive statistics methods such as charts and tabular analysis.

Results and Discussion

Godhan Nyay Yojana is the scheme recently launched on 20 July 2020, on the occasion of Hareli, the first festival of the state by the Chhattisgarh Government. This scheme aims at boosting the rural economy by procuring cow dung at Rs 2 per kg from farmers and cattle rears. From stored dung in Gothan, Vermicompost is made by women SHGs. According to the demand, other items also made from cow dung like diya, flower case, vermi wash, compost, pot etc.

Status of Gothan in Chhattisgarh (A) Total numbers of Gothans in Chhattisgarh

Total approved, under construction and constructed Gothans shown in table 1. Out of total approved Gothans about 94.27 per cent Gothans were fully constructed, 4.87 per cent Gothans were under constructed and 0.86 per cent Gothan was not Constructed.




Fig 1: Gothan Status in Chhattisgarh

(B) Details of Purchased Cow dung under the SchemeTable 2 present details of purchased cow dung in Chhattisgarh under Godhan Nyay Yojna. It was observed that in Bilaspur Division there were maximum numbers (2231 Gothans) of Gothans and maximum quantity

(3003071 quintal) of cow dung were purchased under Durg Division. The table also defines that under Raipur Division there were maximum per cent (68.62 percent) of cow dung distributed to Self Help Groups.

(C) Share of benefits of vermicompost under Godhan Nyay Yojna

Table 3 clearly shows the share of benefits of vermicompost under Godhan Nyay Yojna. The selling price of vermicompost was currently 10 Rs. /Kg from which 5 Rs. /kg was given to samiti for buying cow dung for next vermicompost production. Rupee 0.65 per kg given to self

help groups for packaging, 0.50 Rupee per kg Large Area Multipurpose Society (LAMPS) / Primary Agriculture Credit Society (PACS) & Cooperative banks as commission charge. Out of the remaining 3.85 Rupee, self help groups and samiti's profits were in 85:15 ratios, which were Rupee 3.24 and 0.58 respectively.




Fig 2: Share of benefits of vermicompost under Godhan Nyay Yojna

(D) Details of Vermicompost Production and sale

The table 4 depicts the production and sale of vermicompost under the Godhan Nyay Scheme, the production and sales of vermicompost was very high in Durg division compare to other divisions. In Raipur division there were highest 78.58 per cent of sales and in Bastar Division there were lowest 72.93 percent of sales of vermicompost.

(E) Quantity of Vermicompost: Purchased by different agencies

Table 5 presents details of cow dung purchasing agencies. It can be seen from the table that Chhattisgarh Department of Agriculture purchased highest quantity (10.19 percent) of

vermicompost followed by Chhattisgarh Rajya Sahakari Bank Mydt (6.04 percent), Directorate Horticulture and Farm Forestry (5.41 percent) and Forest Department (2.81 percent).

On the basis of the above study; we may conclude that out of total approved Gothans about 94.27 per cent Gothans were fully constructed, 4.87 per cent Gothans were under constructed and 0.86 per cent Gothan was not Constructed. It was observed that in Bilaspur Division there were maximum

numbers of Gothans and maximum quantity of cow dung were purchased under Durg Division and under Raipur Division there were maximum per cent of cow dung distributed to Self Help Groups. Production and sale of vermicompost under the Godhan Nyay Scheme, the production and sales of vermicompost was very high in Durg division compare to other divisions. In Raipur division there were highest per cent of sales and in Bastar Division there were lowest percent of sales of vermicompost. Chhattisgarh Department of Agriculture purchased highest quantity of vermicompost. These schemes create new employment opportunity in rural areas and the implementation of the scheme also helps in stopping movement of cattle on the roads.
